

A communications company affiliated with the InterDom programs seeks students of journalism, communications, literature and related areas to work in research and editing in a prestigious publication on US and Latin American writers who have made important contributions to Dominican journalism.

Working under the supervision and support of the cultural section, the intern will assist in gathering archival publications within the company which date back to the 19th century. The intern will rapidly learn how the company works through a training program. The internship offers the opportunity to work from 15 to 20 hours per week and to earn transferable college credit.

All applicants must have completed at least five courses of Spanish at the university level or be able to demonstrate equivalent language skills (advanced levels in both written as well as spoken Spanish). The applicant must demonstrate basic computer skills and knowledge of Microsoft programs such as Word, Power Point, and Excel and must have completed at least three courses in areas related to communication, journalism or otherwise similar disciplines.

The organization promotes opportunities for interns to exchange ideas and gives the student the chance to participate actively in other areas of the company where publications of various types are produced including newspapers and magazines with national and international circulation outreach. The intern will acquire professional experience in complex areas of the organization and will learn valuable résumé-enhancing work skills.
