Program Description:

The Global Dominican Academic Exchange at Babson College is a collaborative effort between InteRDom, a program of Global Foundation for Democracy and Development (GFDD), and Babson. The program will bring Dominican university students studying Business and Entrepreneurship to Babson for 7 days, where they will experience the daily life of Babson students, attending classes and special seminars and social events designed to inspire multicultural exchange and intellectual conversation with students and faculty at the highest ranked entrepreneurship education institution in the United States. It provides a unique opportunity for academic and cultural exchange and growth to both Dominican student participants and Babson student hosts.

Dominican participants will live in dormitories with student hosts during the week, with whom they will be paired based on academic and extracurricular interests. By living with fellow undergraduates, participants will fully experience the life of a student at Babson. During the week, participants will attend college classes, club meetings and sporting events with their hosts. Other academic events, including panels and guest lectures, will also be organized by the student hosts at Babson, in order to inspire cross-cultural debate and conversation.

Participants will have the opportunity to tour the historic City of Boston as well as go to the Boston Museum or the Museum of Fine Art.

Applications are due October 16 and must include the online application form, unofficial transcript, CV, copy of passport, copy of valid US Visa and a brief one-page essay in English describing why you are an ideal candidate for this program and how it will contribute to your academic and professional goals.
